About Vineyard College

Vineyard College was launched in 1997, delivering onsite, face-to-face study. In 2003, in response to church and student feedback, we moved to a blended-learning approach, which allowed students to remain in their churches and develop in response to their local context. We love this 'hands on' approach to training people for ministry and are always refining it to make it even better for our students. Our programmes work well with local churches and enable students to stay in a supportive, familiar environment while studying.

Vineyard College works with all kinds of churches from many denominations all over New Zealand. We have a student-focused method of teaching that flexes around the particular needs and circumstances of each student. Students engaged in programmes of study that include internships are supported through one-on-one supervision and mentoring in their church or organisation, together with pastoral care and academic support from the College. This partnership approach to training means we have consistently high graduation rates.

In 2024, we welcome in a new partnership with Laidlaw College, a Category 1 NZQA-accredited tertiary educational institution. We are excited for the enhanced benefits this will create for our students, their academic and pastoral support, and the seamless pathways to further study options this enables.

Laidlaw College is the largest interdenominational theological tertiary institute in Aotearoa New Zealand, offering qualifications from certificate to doctoral level, in the areas of theology and biblical studies, mission, ministry, counselling and teacher education.

Laidlaw provides learning environments for students throughout Aotearoa New Zealand with two support campuses in Auckland, one in Christchurch and distance learning opportunities serving students' learning goals throughout New Zealand irrelevant of where they call home.

Laidlaw is accredited by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority and has approvals to deliver undergraduate programmes like Vineyard College, plus postgraduate level education and research.



Study Information

The programmes available through Vineyard College are:

- Certificate in Christian Ministry Internship leading to the New Zealand Certificate in Ministry (Level 4) with a strand in Internship
- Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) leading to the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (level 5) with a strand in Christian Leadership
- Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) leading to the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (level 5) with a strand in Theological Studies *No internship requirement*

Students are encouraged to study full-time. The Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) is available part-time.

Programmes are available to study via distance learning and blended learning. Course materials and resources are delivered via the Laidlaw learning environment with additional learning and pastoral support by Vineyard College. Laidlaw's Online Learning Management System (learn.laidlaw.ac.nz) is a Moodle web-based educational site where students have access to course and learning support materials. Students submit their assignments through this Moodle environment and receive them back there once they are marked. Laidlaw's online learning environment is a safe, secure learning and communication support space.

Entry Requirements

Vineyard College is open to New Zealand or Australian citizens or those with New Zealand permanent residency.

Students will be required to undertake the Laidlaw College entry process into their programmes of choice. Vineyard College is ready to support students through this process.

Support

Vineyard College is committed to the success of our students. In partnership with Laidlaw College, we seek to provide appropriate support to work alongside students to meet their study goals.

The first week of study will commence with orientation. Distance and blended modes of learning students will be required to complete a short online orientation course. This free course called Studying@Laidlaw shares the Moodle online learning environment and expectations of study in an introductory course.

Throughout the academic year, Vineyard College students have the benefit of Vineyard support in partnership with Laidlaw College academic teaching and learning support. Choosing Vineyard College as your place of learning enables the very best of our two institutions to support you in your learning goals.

Time requirements

Hours of study vary significantly between students, so it's hard to pin down just how long any individual student will take to complete a course.

However, full-time study is considered to be up to 30 hours a week, including reading, practical work and assignments, so students should be mindful of that when enrolling.

Part-time study will vary depending on the number of courses taken, but as a rough guide a student should expect to spend about 7 to 8 hours a week on any individual course they are undertaking.

Students will be provided with a college email address. Student email addresses will be used by Vineyard College and Laidlaw College staff to communicate with students. Please note that all email correspondence will be sent to this address once the account has been created.

Vineyard College really grounded my faith in understanding biblical truths that were always there, but where I had not properly connected the dots.



Certificate in Christian Ministry -Internship*

LEVEL 4

The Certificate of Christian Ministry provides a pathway for emerging Christian leaders to pursue ministry formation and theological study while serving their churches. Students develop knowledge, skills and experience by connecting their own reflection on the Christian faith with real life practical contexts, equipping them for service in the church. The Certificate of Christian Ministry programme also provides a pathway into further study.

Graduates will be able to:

- Integrate foundational knowledge of selected biblical principles and Christian beliefs and apply them to specified communities, acknowledging bicultural or multicultural context.
- · Apply biblical and theological principles to their own faith journey and to that of others.
- Apply biblical, theological and ministry skills in a mentored practical ministry context to support the spiritual development of individuals and groups.
- · Organise and prioritise tasks and responsibilities in the provision of practical ministry to individuals and groups.
- · Set goals and make plans for providing practical ministry to individuals and groups.

Entry Requirements Acceptance into the programme

includes:

- NCEA level 2 or equivalent
- A literacy and numeracy test
- Supported internship placement with their faith community
- A satisfactory New Zealand Police clearance

116.415 ENCOUNTERING THE BIBLE

This course introduces students to the Bible and explores the major themes that occur throughout Genesis to Revelation. It also shows how the Bible can be read so that it speaks into our lives, ministries, and workplaces.

216.415 BASICS OF CHRISTIAN **BELIEF**

This course introduces students to key ideas and concepts that form the heart of Christian belief. Students will examine how these ideas fit together and shape Christian life and faith, and how they can interact with the wider community.

416.415 DISCIPLESHIP

This course introduces students to aspects of discipleship through engagement with Scripture, personal reflection and directed exercises connecting faith, life and ministry.

506.415 FAITH IN ACTION

This course introduces students to a range of different contexts where Christian faith is being lived out. Students will be introduced to a model of action-reflection to assist them in connecting faith and life in their own context and the contexts of others.

472.430 MINISTRY INTERNSHIP I

This Internship course offers an introduction to personal development and the principles of self and task management within the student's ministry context. It fosters reflection on the attributes and character of a leader by exploring qualities necessary for service that empowers others.

473.430 MINISTRY INTERNSHIP II **PRE-REQUISITE: 472**

This Internship course offers an extension of Ministry Internship I by strengthening organisational skills through service in a selected area within the student's ministry context. Students will reflect on their own sense of call in relation to personal strengths.

Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership)*

LEVEL 5

The aim of the Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) programme is to produce graduates who are able to apply a range of key leadership skills to build, lead, and contribute to teams that fulfil organisational goals within church, mission, and community contexts.

Students who complete the Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian

Leadership) may staircase into the second year of the Laidlaw College Bachelor of Theology degree.

Graduates of the Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) will be able to:

- Evaluate and apply a broad understanding of theology and biblical foundations to defined contexts based on textual interpretation and religious practice.
- Evaluate a ministry programme based on strategies that integrate personal and community faith journeys, and the social, cultural and other contextual considerations of defined groups.
- Apply key Christian leadership principles to facilitate team development and accomplish organisational goals in particular areas of responsibility in Christian ministry.

Entry Requirements

Acceptance into the programme includes:

- NCEA level 3 or equivalent
- Literacy and numeracy requirements
- Supported internship placement with their faith community
- A satisfactory New Zealand Police clearance

115.515 READING THE BIBLE

This course approaches the Bible from the perspective of biblical theology, which allows the Bible to tell its own story as a unified grand narrative that culminates in the person and work of Jesus Christ. Students explore the unity, diversity and central themes of the Bible to make sense of the relationship between Scripture, theology, and all of life.

201.515 ENGAGING THEOLOGY

This course introduces systematic theology and teaches learners to think theologically. It examines God's self-revelation, how we can understand that revelation, and why it is foundational for our faith. It then explores the arrangement of this revelation into a set of core beliefs and their application to everyday living.

401.515 FORMATION

This course aims to help learners reflect on personal and communal spiritual formation, through engagement with Scripture, theological understandings, and a variety of Christian spiritual traditions.

505.515 CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP & MISSION

This course applies a lens of Christian leadership and mission to the evaluation of personal and community faith journeys, ministry programmes within the student's context and own emerging sense of call and mission.

474.530 LEADERSHIP INTERNSHIP I

This Internship course aims to evaluate Christian leadership models within the context of church, mission, and community ministries. Interns will build, lead, and contribute to teams in a way which reflects their sense of call and personal strengths, and through the application of leadership practices that enhance the goals of their chosen ministry.

475.530 LEADERSHIP INTERNSHIP II **PRE-REQUISITE: 474**

This Internship course offers an extension of Leadership Internship I to apply a range of key Christian leadership skills to develop and lead a team. The intern will reflect on team dynamics and project management within their ministry context and contribute to the goals of a church, mission, or community ministry.

Diploma in Christian **Studies** (Theological Studies)*

LEVEL 5

The aim of the Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) programme is to produce graduates who are able to integrate a broad understanding of theology based on scriptural foundations and ministry practices, and apply these to church, mission, and community contexts in ways that are culturally and ethically appropriate.

Students who complete the Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies)

may staircase into the second year of the Laidlaw College Bachelor of Theology degree.

Graduates of the Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) will be able to:

- Evaluate and apply a broad understanding of theology and biblical foundations to defined contexts based on textual interpretation and religious practice.
- Evaluate a ministry programme based on strategies that integrate personal and community faith journeys, and the social, cultural and other contextual considerations of defined groups.
- Integrate core tools of theology, biblical texts and ministry practice, and apply these to the broader community to provide leadership and direction that is culturally and ethically appropriate.

115.515 READING THE BIBLE

This course approaches the Bible from the perspective of biblical theology, which allows the Bible to tell its own story as a unified grand narrative that culminates in the person and work of lesus Christ. Students explore the unity, diversity and central themes of the Bible to make sense of the relationship between Scripture, theology, and all of life.

120.515 READING THE OLD **TESTAMENT**

This course explores a broad understanding of the Old Testament and introduces students to the interpretation and application of the Old Testament in church, mission, and/or community.

140.515 READING THE NEW **TESTAMENT**

This course explores a broad understanding of New Testament foundations, and their interpretation and application within church, mission, and community contexts.

201.515 ENGAGING THEOLOGY

This course introduces systematic theology and teaches learners to think theologically. It examines God's selfrevelation, how we can understand that revelation, and why it is foundational for our faith. It then explores the arrangement of this revelation into a set of core beliefs and their application to everyday living.

308.515 THE STORY OF CHRISTIANITY

This course develops an integrative understanding of how Christian theology, practice, culture and institutions have developed over history. such that students can better narrate the wider context of their leadership.

401.515 FORMATION

This course aims to help learners reflect on personal and communal spiritual formation, through engagement with Scripture, theological understandings, and a variety of Christian spiritual traditions

505.515 CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP & MISSION

This course applies a lens of Christian leadership and mission to the evaluation of personal and community faith journeys, plus ministry programmes within the student's context and own emerging sense of call and mission.

907.515 BICULTURAL **RELATIONSHIPS: TIKANGA KAWENATA**

This course introduces Tikanga Māori on the basis of understanding people in their contexts, and combines theological, theoretical and historical reflection with the development of practices drawn from an integration of these. The course includes regular oral activities aimed at developing fluency in the use of te reo and tikanga in a range of settings. The culmination of this oral learning is participation in the Noho Marae, where an overnight stay on a marae provides an integrated opportunity to engage with Māori culture beyond the classroom.

The tuition fee for the Diploma Studies) is \$6726.00 per full-time



General Information

Our academic study year has two commencement dates, in February and July. The study commencement in February finishes in November. The study commencement in July finishes in June of the following year.

This incorporates 39 weeks of study including seven weeks of holiday. Fulltime students do a minimum of 30 hours of study per week made up of directed and self-directed learning and practical ministry internship if applicable to their programme choice. For internship courses, churches and organisations provide students with a mentor and a supervisor to help direct their practical work and contribute towards pastoral care and support. Vineyard College partners with churches to provide outstanding pastoral support for each student. This is a great opportunity to develop leaders who can help expand the ministry of the local church.

Vineyard College is funded through the Tertiary Education Commission and governed by the Vinevard Churches Aotearoa New Zealand board of directors, who are all active in ministry. Vineyard College is accredited to provide a New Zealand Certificate in Christian Ministry (Level 4) and a New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Christian Leadership) (Level 5) by the New Zealand Qualifications Authority under section 441 of the Education and Training Act 2020. Through partnership, Vineyard College students engage in the above Laidlaw College programmes of study. Through the Laidlaw College partnership, the New Zealand Diploma in Christian Studies (Theological Studies) (Level 5) is also available to Vinevard College students and is accredited by New Zealand Qualifications Authority.

Vineyard College is a Category 2 NZQA-accredited tertiary educational institution. Laidlaw College is a Category 1 NZQA-accredited tertiary educational institution.

All Vineyard College programmes are eligible for fees free, student loans and allowances.

CREDIT RECOGNITION AND TRANSFER



WITHDRAWALS & REFUNDS

Students who withdraw within eight
days of commencement of courses
will be refunded all fees paid, less an
administration fee of 10%.
Students who withdraw later than
eight days but less than 40 days after
commencement of courses may be
refunded a maximum of \$500 or 50% of
the tuition fees, whichever is the lesser
amount, at the discretion of the College.
Students who withdraw later than 40 days
after commencement of courses will not be
eligible for any refund of tuition fees.
